## Maths

### Number – multiplication and Division

- To recall multiplication and division facts up to 12 x 12
- Count in multiples of 6, 7, 9 25 and 100
- Use place value known and derived facts to multiply and divide mentally including multiplying by 0 and 1, dividing by 1; multiplying together 3 numbers
- Problem solving

### Measurement- Area/Perimeter/length

- Solve investigations and problems through calculating area and perimeter

### Fractions and Decimals

- Recognise and show, using diagrams, families of common equivalent fractions
- Add and subtract fractions with the same denominator
- Count up and down in 1/100s and 1/10s
- Recognise and write decimal equivalence to 1/4, 1/3 and 3/4
- Rounding decimals to the nearest whole number

### Gymnastics:

Balances and Bridges – Children explore balance and bridges and combine to form simple sequences

### Invasion Games:

Continue developing passing and ball handling skills through Football, Hockey and Tag Rugby
